

Assistant Professor, Gerontology, Simon Fraser University, Vancouver, Canada

The Gerontology Department at Simon Fraser University invites applications for a threeyear limited-term position at the Assistant Professor rank beginning September 1, 2005 or **January 1, 2006**. The successful candidate will teach four courses each year. Priority courses include: Introduction to Gerontology, Health Promotion and Aging, Health and Illness in Later Life, and Research Methods in Gerontology. Previous teaching in gerontology is an asset. Other duties will include initiating or continuing research and participating in departmental committee work. Candidates should have a PhD or equivalent. Salary will be commensurate with experience and qualifications. See policy A20.02 for the salary scale on the SFU web site. The Department, established in 1983, currently offers a minor in Gerontology, a Post Baccalaureate Diploma, and a Master's Degree and is proposing a Ph.D. program. SFU is at the leading edge of gerontological research and education in Canada, and has a reputation as one of the best comprehensive universities in the country. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority. SFU is committed to the principle of equity in employment and offers equal opportunities to qualified women and men, including visible minorities, aboriginal people and persons with disabilities. This position is subject to budgetary approval. Applicants should include a covering letter, curriculum vitae, two samples of their publications, and the names of three references.
