- Posters should be eye-catching as well as scientifically accurate and tastefully laid out.

Critical Attributes of Effective Posters

- Preparation
 - Define your audience
 - Deliver coherent and effective message
- Content
 - Original, well planned & thoroughly researched
- Presentation
 - Effectively present your poster using graphics or figures

Choose fonts that are legible

• Use upper and lower case type throughout the poster • ALL UPPER CASE TYPE IS MORE DIFFICULT TO READ



Provide captions for your graphics
















Presentation

- · Prior to the meeting
 - Check for the size and orientation of poster
 - Bring handouts that include the abstract and any supplementary information
- Just before the meeting
 - Arrive 20-30 minutes before the scheduled poster session
 - Set up the poster on the board with the number that corresponds to number of your presentation as it appears in the program
