Save Stan is an annual event at which students, faculty and community representatives participate in a day of inter professional (IP) health team simulations and learning scenarios in a safe, but realistic environment. Students, faculty and volunteers from multiple disciplines and institutions work together, using their combined skills, learning "... with, from and about each other to improve collaboration and quality of care." (CAIPE, 2002) Standardized Patients, state-of-the-art mannequins, and genuine medical and hospital equipment are all used to create an authentic experience.







Bedside Shift Report CoACT NEW

Engage patients, families and Care Hub members in change of shift communication.

Biopsy Team Communication NEW

Reflect on effective communication strategies between medical staff and how potential errors can be addressed in a constructive manner while protecting the patient.

Breaking Bad

"Breaking Bad" is a game where students will break the stereotypes that follow different healthcare professions. A self directed case study will also be available which will allow students to see the full spectrum of care of a particular case.

Can You Handle This?

A patient transfer does not go according to plan. The health team must work together to keep the patient safe.

Communication Survival Skills (STARS)

Participate in a thought provoking and emotional simulation designed to highlight communication survival skills when you need them most!!

Creative Communication

Working as a team allows health care providers to maximize their expertise and communicate with the patient in unique circumstances.

ER Mash-up

In this dynamic simulated ER the health care team works together to triage, diagnose, treat, problem solve and balance competing priorities.

Help My Baby

A student in a primary care network waiting room encounters a young mother who appears stressed by her crying baby.

Hospital to Homecare Part 1

The health team works together to review Stanley Moorhouse's hospital chart to plan for his discharge from the hospital.

Hospital to Homecare Part 2

Students conduct a Home Care visit with Stanley Moorhouse and his wife.

Inner City Youth

Complex and high risk practice environments make interdisciplinary teamwork and communication essential. Students practice working in teams to provide the best patient care to assess and treat an inner city youth.

Mental Health Intervention

Plan and approach a client with a personality disorder during an exacerbation of symptoms.

Motivational interviews UPDATED

What does a team do when their concerns for a patient don't seem to be the same concerns the patient has for himself?

How do you communicate to a visitor when they are making an error that has potentially hazardous results?

One More Thing...

Bedside care providers collaborate to help a client mobilize safely.

OR IPE Simulation Observation NEW

The health care team communicates with an operative client before, during and after surgery.

Palliative Care

Grace has terminal cancer and has signed a care directive for comfort care. In this home care scenario, her husband has second thoughts.

Patient Assessment Gone Bad

This simulation challenges students to find an approach as a team in working with agitated patients while still ensuring their physical safety in a patient care area.

Pharmacy Interventions

Two professionals collaborate on best practice when doing a narcotic count.

Post-Op UPDATED

Stanley Moorhouse has had emergency surgery following a motor vehicle crash. He experiences trouble while recovering.

PreHospital Emergency NEW

A team approach is particularly critical to the patient outcome when responding to a pre-hospital emergency.

Prenatal Checkup

This simulation challenges students to use resources and expand their comfort zone during a prenatal checkup.

Say What?

Explore factors that impact effective and ineffective reporting between health care providers from different disciplines.

Watch a health care related video in a small group and discuss the teamwork and communication challenges that arose during the video.

Street Smarts UPDATED

A first responder experience while working "on the street".

Team members interact with a continuing care resident with middle-stage dementia, and her daughter who is having difficulty coping with mom's disease process.

Team Interviews

Health care providers minimize patient storytelling fatigue by conducting patient interviews together. Students learn with and from their health team colleagues.

Teamwork Skills in a Crisis NEW

The health care team maximizes collaboration during a patient crisis.
