Humanity and Responsibility

Islam teaches that human beings are born in a state of purity, as well as with a natural moral sense that enables one to differentiate between what is good and what is not. Prophets of God were sent to humanity to perfect good conduct in order to bring to fruition the seeds of virtue that reside in the original human nature. As we grow, we are able to make decisions which foster these seeds or shun them.

Although the instinct of morality exists in humanity, worldly realities often make choosing right over wrong difficult. The Quran praises those who choose to sharpen their moral sense: and it condemns those in whom it has become so dull that the ugliness of sin becomes beauty in their eyes. Each individual is accountable to God for the path he or she chooses.
