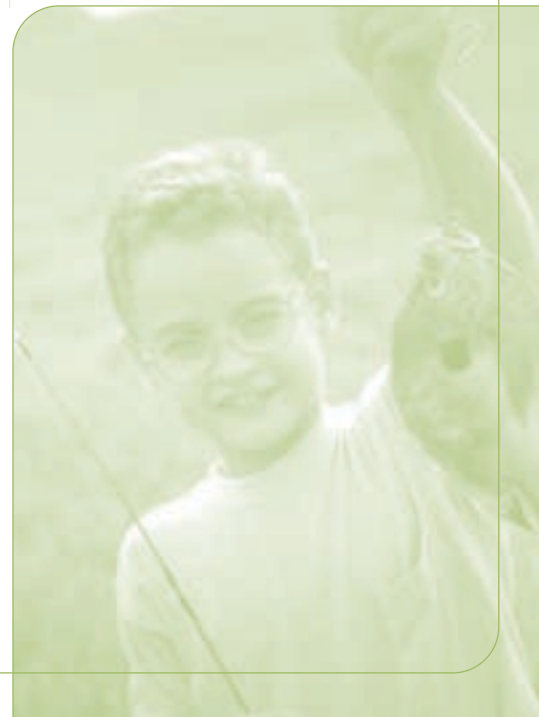

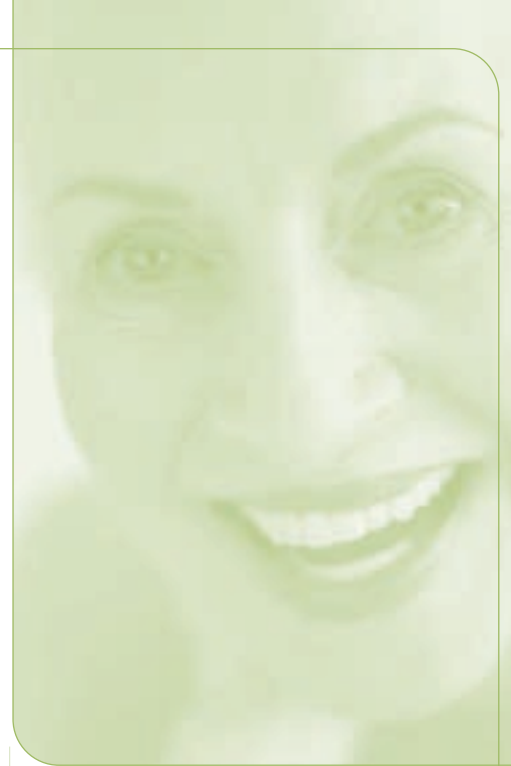
Faculty of Education

Faculty of Education Clinic

Undergraduate and graduate students from the Education Clinic provide individual and group help to 800 - 1000 community members of all ages. Services include reading and language assessments and follow-up remediation, educational and psychological assessments, reports and debriefings and planning for special needs students. Professor Henry Janzen coordinates the Clinic, which is open 7 days a week, evenings and weekends, in order to serve the community. Faculty members supervise all students.

Volunteer Time: 10,000 hours (55 students)

Result: Provision of the only free educational clinic in Edmonton, and in rural areas where few professional services exist. Individuals and school professionals call upon the clinic for an objective, thorough, scholarly and scientific analysis or opinion.



Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research Outreach Program

Under the supervision of Outreach Coordinator, Dr Renee Polziehn, this unique office serves students from K-12, community groups, and colleges. The Program provides presentations, demonstrations, tours, and hand-on labs that enhance learning and highlight research at the University. The program also emphasizes literacy through events such as Read-In. The Outreach Program is launching an interdisciplinary online journal for high school students to complement the graduate student version. Outreach is also a partner in the Outdoor Research Park at New Sarepta that will focus on anthropological and ecological studies underway at the University. Graduate students, faculty, staff, undergraduates, and alumni provide support for the Program.

Result: Teachers, parents, and students gain exposure to research and innovations at the University. Graduate students are given a means of connecting to their community and they serve as role models and mentors for students of all ages. Schools with limited resources are able to enhance the learning experience for both teachers and students.

Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry Department of Dentistry

Open Wide Free Dental Clinic

The objective of this program is to provide free basic dental services to the poorer members of the

Edmonton community in a one-day clinic, which was held on April 6, 2002.

Volunteer Time: 3,735 hours (415 volunteers)

Result: Provided examinations, x-rays, cleanings, extractions and fillings to individuals. The total cost, had the services been supplied by private dentists would have been \$67,137.

Faculty of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences

Pharmacy Class of 2006

Since 1994, each pharmacy student volunteers a minimum of 50 hours at a long term care facility or health agency of their choice as part of an experiential program in the first year of the pharmacy program. The program was established to provide the students with an opportunity to work directly with patients to enhance their understanding of patients' needs and to build their communication skills with both residents/clients and the staff of the facilities/agencies. Through journaling, written assignments, and small group discussions, the students reflect on issues such as building relationships, patient-centeredness, concepts of illness, looking at the whole patient, conflict resolution, and how they can learn about themselves as future health care providers.

Volunteer Time: 5,600 hours (109 volunteers)

Result: Helped contribute to the quality of life for the residents/clients through one-on-one visiting, reading, playing musical instruments,

and being involved in various recreation programs such as playing cards, group outings, bingo, and pool therapy.

Faculty of Physical Education and Recreation Department of Athletics

Teaming Up for Tobacco Free Kids Program.

Over 70 University of Alberta student-athletes participated in over 180 school visits to elementary schools in 2002.

Volunteer Time: 750 hours (70 volunteers)

Result: Over 7,500 Grade 6 children participated in the program, and received a 45-60 minute presentation on the perils of using tobacco products.

Faculty of Rehabilitation Medicine Department of Speech Pathology and Audiology

Corbett Clinic

Corbett Clinic provides speech and language therapy to children from the community during three 12-week treatment blocks beginning in January, September and May. Clients are assessed and treated by student clinicians working on their Master's Degree in Speech Language Pathology. These students work together with and are supervised by Speech Language Pathologists from the community. Upon completion of the treatment block clients are returned to the waiting list for additional service through the clinic, referred to community programs for follow up or discharged, if further service is no longer warranted.

Volunteer Time: 2,019 hours (40 volunteers)

Result: The program offers treatment options that might not otherwise be present in the community. Corbett Clinic also supplements treatment coordinated at the community level. Clients benefit and progress with biweekly or weekly service schedules. The impact is also realized in the training of the Speech Language Pathology students as their skills are nurtured and enhanced in a structured and supportive setting before they are placed in community sites, thereby facilitating successful placements.

Faculty of Science Department of Biological Sciences

Microscopy Unit

The Microscopy Unit staff members (Rakesh

Bhatnagar, Randy Mandryk and Jack Scott) conducted numerous demonstration sessions for application of microscopy in Biology for elementary and high school students. This allowed students and teachers to learn how a variety of microscopes are used in research. The demonstrations included operation of simple microscopes as well as advanced digital instrumentation such as Environmental Scanning Electron Microscope, Transmission Electron Microscope and Confocal Laser Scanning Microscopes.

Volunteer Time: 150 hours (3 volunteers)

Result: These sessions provided an excellent opportunity to senior high school students, in consideration of careers in Science and Biology.

Circle K International Volunteer Club

Many university students wish to volunteer, but do not have the time for the regular commitment that many organizations require. Circle K caters to these students by working with nearly 200 organizations to set up a calendar of one-time volunteer opportunities. Student members can then sign-up for assignments of their choice. Administrative volunteers with Circle K oversee the events, ensure that students have transportation to the project, that volunteer hours are accurately recorded, and that the projects are evaluated. In addition, Circle K holds general meetings every week, publishes a regular bulletin for the members, attend and host national and international conferences, provide \$1500 worth of scholarships for our members each year, and organize socials to help our volunteers become acquainted with each other.

Volunteer Time: 6,000 hours (200 volunteers)

Result: Every year, over 200 Circle K volunteers participate in over 100 volunteer projects. Some of the organizations that we work with include the Food Bank, Lurana Women's Shelter, Uncles at Large, Kids Kottage, St Joe's Auxilliary Hospital, the Bissel Centre, the Arbutus Foundation, Atonement Home, the Edmonton Heritage Festival, Operation Friendship, the Canadian Cross Cancer Society, the Youth Emergency Shelter, the Edmonton Art Gallery, UNICEF, the Edmonton SPCA... and many, many, many more!

Student Volunteer Community (SVCC) Student Group

SVCC is a volunteer-run organization that aims to provide ESL instruction to adult immigrants through its volunteer teachers and executives.

Other services offered include Chinese classes and Language Arts help for children.

Volunteer Time: 7,200 hours (50 volunteers)

Result: Provided affordable English classes to immigrants and refugees to help them communicate better in their daily lives and learn about our culture. The small, flexible classes and relaxed atmosphere enable students to learn in a friendly environment and meet other people.

United Way Campaign

2002 University of Alberta United Way Campaign Committee

2002 University of Alberta United Way Campaign Committee members who worked tirelessly in their respective departments and acted as liaisons with the Co-Chairs and Loaned Representative to make the 2002 U of A Campaign the most successful ever. Members organized events, met with individuals in their departments, delivered pledge forms and answered questions, and promoted U of A events. They also attended several meetings to discuss overall strategy for the campaign and to monitor results.

Volunteer Time: 940 hours (47+ volunteers)

Result: This was the most successful campaign ever run by the U of A. Donations through the United Way campaign benefited in excess of 100 federally registered non-profit agencies and are used to directly support services in the Edmonton Capital Region.
