The Exploring Métis Identity Through Archaeology (EMITA) project in the Department of Anthropology at the University of Alberta is seeking graduate students for the 2017-2018 year. This SSHRC funded project uses archaeological, historical, and indigenous knowledge to understand the Métis archaeological record in Alberta and Saskatchewan. Students accepted to the program will join an interdisciplinary team of scholars working on research questions of importance to archaeology, indigenous communities, and contemporary legal issues around Métis identity in Canada. We are looking for PhD students (MA students will also be considered) to focus on one of the following areas:

- Faunal analysis
- Artifact analysis
- Ethnobotanical analysis
- Geoarchaeology
- Oral history
- Archaeology of gender

Qualifications:

- MA/MSc in Anthropology/Archaeology or a related discipline (BA/BSc if applying to the Masters program) with an excellent academic record
- Field and laboratory experience
- Interest in indigenous/community-based archaeology
- Interest in historical archaeology
- Indigenous students are encouraged to apply

The project can offer funding support for students who are accepted to the program.
