Thirteen prescribed fire situations that shout watch out?

I propose to review Maupin's¹ thirteen prescribed fire situations that shout watch out in light of my unique personal experiences in prescribed fire across Canada since this publication. The review will rely on short case studies of individual burning operations, as well as on amalgamated lessons learned from repeated experiences. It is anticipated Maupin's original watch outs could be modified or morphed into standard prescribed fire orders beneficial to future 21st century prescribed fire operations.

Burn orders #1 - don't play with fire, its serious **B**usiness

b**U**rn orders #2 - fire **U**se requires a plan

buRn orders #3 - Rely on the plan & speak up when you're deviating

bur**N** orders #4 – deviation requires a **N**ew plan

burn Orders #5 – implement One plan at a time

burn oRders #6 - Rely on local talent to plan, implement & monitor

burn or **D**ers #7 – **D**efine reasonable containment lines and actions

burn ord Ers #8 - plan for Escaped fire

burn orde**R**s #9 – **R**emain on site

burn order \$ #10 - celebrate small \$uccesses but review ops daily
